Investment in BBC ALBA

The Scottish Government is pleased with the progress and achievements of BBC ALBA since its launch in 2008. We also welcome the productive collaboration between the BBC and MG ALBA that has made this possible.

We have both made important investments in the channel, BBC ALBA, and I am confident we share the ambition of its continued success. This success has been demonstrated in core broadcasting indicators but also in wider benefits for the economy, employment, skills, education, the Gaelic language and more.
